Final Water Testing Results Knollwood, Troy Hills

We notified you earlier that as a result of the issue of lead in the schools drinking water in Newark, New Jersey, the Parsippany-Troy Hills Township School District made the decision to have the water tested in all of our 14 schools. As part of the testing procedures, all drinking fountains, food preparation, and Home Economics classrooms were tested. We released the partial results to you and now have the final results for the remaining classrooms that were tested for the schools listed below. All results will be posted on our website.

Knollwood Elementary School

Boiler Room Valve – 17.9 ppb

All other samples in the school were below the threshold of 15 ppb.

Troy Hills Elementary School:

Guidance Office Faucet – 19.4 ppb

Action Plan - The fountain in this room was shut down and water provided for staff and students.
All other samples in the school were below the threshold of 15 ppb.

This concludes all water testing for Knollwood and Troy Hills Schools.
